Testimony from the Mission Field

We are sad to announce that our national missions worker PL's father KS had passed away four days ago at the age of 69. But we are glad that his father had become a Christian before his death. KS was a high-ranking government servant and a member of the ruling party. He objected furiously to PL's conversion and gave PL tremendous pressure to stay away from the Christian faith. He put the missionary who led PL to Christ into prison and later had the government expel him from the country. PL not only kept his faith, but he even served the Lord full-time in the university ministry. KS was so embarrassed and angered with his son for not only being a Christian but also being imprisoned six times for serving the Lord! He had many times threatened to sever the relationship with PL. However, we believe that the perseverance of PL's faith and his faithfulness in serving God moved his father. KS decided to follow PL in his journey of faith and became a Christian upon his retirement. He lost

most of his retirement benefits because of his conversion. However, he was as strong as his son in his faith and remained a Christian even after having to forgo all his benefits till the last moment of his life. I had the privilege to visit him twice and the last one was four weeks ago with a coworker. KS was combating tuberculosis and suffering from diabetes too. We thank God for his beautiful testimony! According to local traditions, the deceased body must be returned and be buried in one's own village. However, the villagers strongly opposed a Christian burial in their Buddhist cemetery. PL and his family reasoned with the village chief about their legal right and put him to shame for denying their father's burial even though KS was a past village leader and made tremendous contributions to the community over the years! Finally, the village Chief gave in, and PL's father was buried in the village in peace. KS was probably the first Christian witness who stood firm in his faith among the Buddhists in the village even to his death! Hallelujah!
