

God Is: Meditations on the Attributes of God

God is ... Unchanging

Psalms 102:25-28

Because we live in a world of constant change, all of us are longing for stability – for an immovable, unshakable Rock upon which we can anchor our volatile lives. Scripture would point us to the immutable God who never changes.

1. Defining God's Immutability

- a. God is immutable in that he is unchanging in his nature, his character, his purposes, and his promises; and yet God is neither indifferent nor impersonal, for he responds and relates to mutable beings like us with reliable consistency.

2. Demonstrating God's Immutability

- a. God never changes in his nature (Ps 102:25-28)

- b. God never changes in his character (Ex 34:6-7)

- c. God never changes in his purposes (Ps 33:10-11; Isa 46:9-11)

- d. God never changes in his promises (Mal 3:6)

3. Drawing Implications of God's Immutability

- a. His immutability is a strong encouragement to pray

- b. His immutability is a strong comfort to his children

- c. His immutability is a strong warning to the unrepentant

- d. His immutability is a strong assurance if we repent and trust in Jesus
