Every Christian goes through spiritual winters of the soul where we are

forced to ask ourselves, "Has God stopped working in my life?" Advent is his timeless answer to this unsettling question.	
1.	Have hope since God never stops working in the lives of his people even though we are flawed (vv2-6a)
2.	Have hope since God never stops working in the lives of his people even when we are under his judgment (vv6b-11)
3.	Have hope since God never stops working in the lives of his people even when he seems absent (vv12-16)
